

Throughout the year, several regional schools visit the Open Kitchen in Nottingham to hear from the beneficiaries and donate food items. Recently, teachers and students from Jamia al Hudaa visited the Open Kitchen. Throughout the morning, the girls and their teacher met with service users, learned more about the Open Kitchen and Muslim Hands, and donated food items.

Adey and Jodi from The Health Shop and the peer-to-peer Naloxone project have been offering support and guidance to beneficiaries with drug addiction. Both organisations aim to educate beneficiaries on drug addiction and health promotion.

Jasmine Banton from Refugee Roots, a refugee charity based in Nottingham, visited the Kitchen. Jasmine was highly impressed with the quality of the food and service provided. Refugee Roots will work with the Open Kitchen to support and empower asylum seekers and refugees.


Nottingham City Council Housing Services have joined forces with the Open Kitchen. The Council will visit the Open Kitchen fortnightly to provide advice on all housing-related matters during the sessions.

We also had a visit from Nahida Ahmed, the Director of People and Inclusion at the Trussell Trust.

Second Chance Learning Academy has been visiting the Open Kitchen to support the hub users. Maria has been coming to the Open Kitchen weekly, training and supporting beneficiaries in developing their CVs. One of our regular users, Paul, has now found a job after being out of employment for a few years, thanks to Maria's support. To celebrate, we surprised Maria and Paul with a celebratory cake!

Additionally, a Muslim Hands staff member knitted a lovely small jersey, which was gifted to a young girl who uses our service.

#### **DANCE CHARITY CLASS**

Bhangra Charity Class, a Leicester dance school, was impressed with the work Muslim Hands is doing in combatting food insecurity in Nottingham.

They were eager to fundraise for this amazing cause and invited our team to visit the dance studio. The class attendees generously donated over £300.



#### **OPEN KITCHEN EID CELEBRATION**

The Open Kitchen in Nottingham successfully organised an Eid celebration for the local community.

During the festival, Muslim Hands organised multiple activities, including inflatables, clothing stalls, food, refreshments, and an ice cream van. The celebration aimed to raise funds to provide free hot meals to beneficiaries impacted by the cost-of-living crisis.

Naser Hussain (event organiser) also met Guninder, Community Engagement Manager for the Nottinghamshire Fire Rescue Service. The Police and Fire services also had stalls at the event to share key messages with the community.

Eid celebrations did not stop there; at The Open Kitchen Nottingham, we displayed Eid Mubarak banners, and the beneficiaries were given treats on the day to celebrate the joyous occasion.

Muslim Hands distributed UK Qurbani meat to local partners in Hounslow, Manchester, and Nottingham. In Nottingham, the meat was given to Himmah Food Bank to distribute to beneficiaries, who otherwise may not get the opportunity to eat meat.

The Church of England School invited the Open Kitchen to participate in their Eid school event. Imran, the coordinator, attended on behalf of the Open Kitchen.

We also received an invitation from Bookers Wholesale to join their Eid celebrations with their partners in Manchester. Alhamdulillah, over £1500 was donated to the cause on the night. A big thank you to Lakhbir and Rohit for the invite and generous donation!

A local Mosque reached out to collaborate with Muslim Hands Open Kitchen to hold an Eid event at their venue. This was another wonderful gesture, as the proceeds went to the Open Kitchen to feed the local community.

#### FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT

Muslim Hands has supported the Gambian community by helping raise funds for their Masjid in Nottingham.
