Guidance for Writing to Your Sponsored Child

Thank you for your generous support. Writing a letter to your sponsored child can be a meaningful way to offer encouragement and show that you care. This guidance ensures respectful and safe communication that prioritises the well-being and privacy of the children

How to Send Your Letter

- We do recommend that letters are written in simple English so that they can be communicated effectively.
- You may send a maximum of two letters during the one-year sponsorship period, either as hard copies or via email.
- All correspondence will be reviewed by our team to ensure the content is suitable and aligns with Muslim Hands' policies.
- Once approved, your letter will be forwarded to your sponsored child through our local field office.

What to Write About

You're welcome to:

- Share general information about yourself, such as your hobbies, interests, or family.
- Word of encouragement and support for their studies and personal growth.
- Ask simple, thoughtful questions (e.g., about their favourite subject or activities they enjoy in school, their hobbies).

Topics to Avoid

Please avoid topics that may be sensitive or inappropriate, including:

- Discussions of expensive items or lifestyle differences.
- Religious or political content.
- Personal contact information such as your address, phone number, or social media handles.

Response from the Child

Any replies from the child will be sent electronically via our field office and reviewed before being shared with you.

Please note replies from children are optional and not guaranteed, as they are not obligated to respond.
