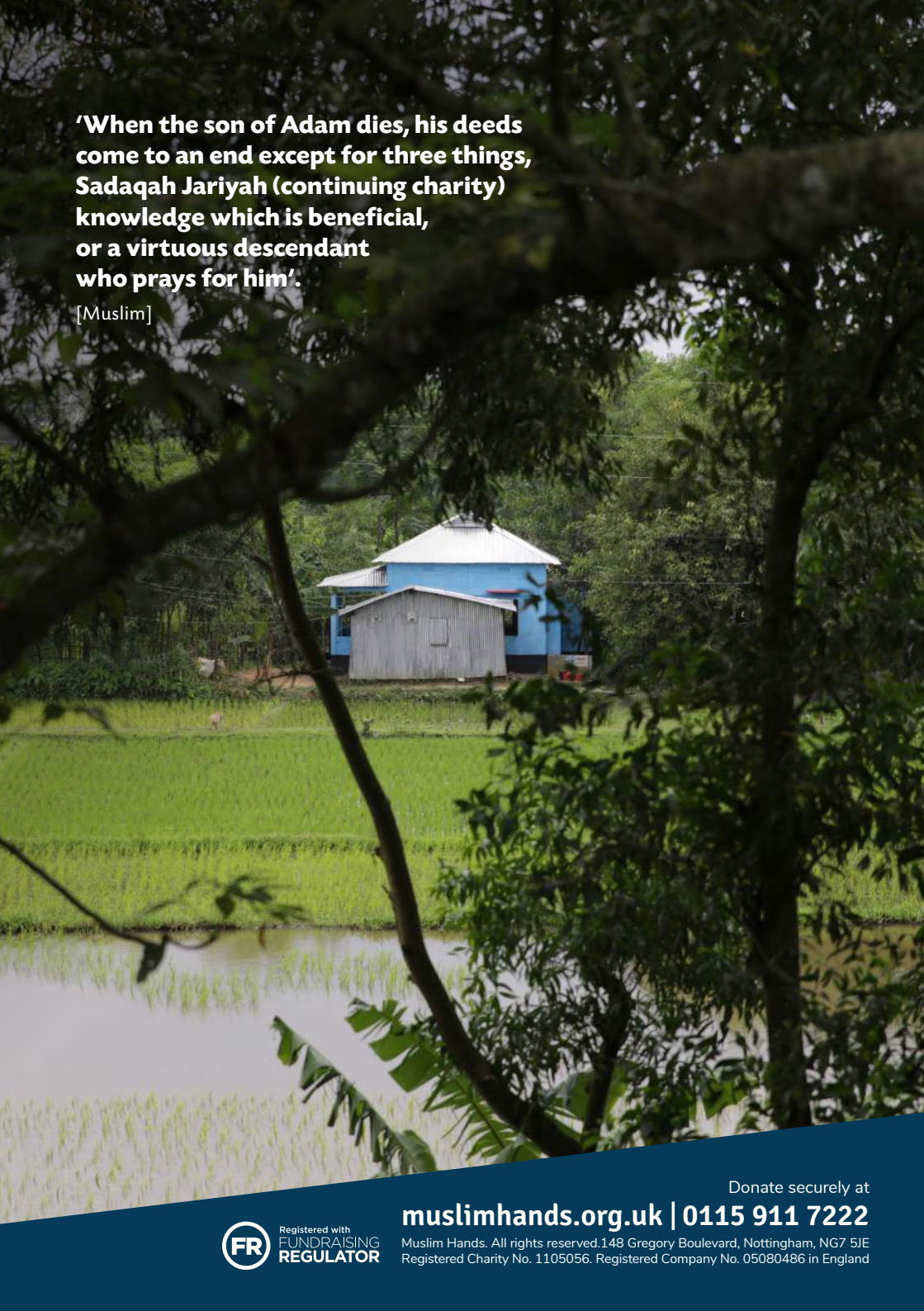
Why should I set up a charity project in my will?
