Indonesia Tsunami Emergency: Update

ess than three months after the terrible 7.5 magnitude earthquake of September 2018, tragedy struck Indonesia again. On Saturday 22nd December, a deadly tsunami triggered by the eruption of Anna Krakatau devastated the islands of Sumatra and Java. More than 430 people were killed and over 1,400 were injured. Giant waves crashed into islands still recovering from the 2004 tsunami, destroying everything in their path, including the homes of 16,000 people.

In the wake of the disaster, our teams were on the ground providing emergency aid to nearly 4,000 people. Your donations provided them with vital items such as food parcels, cooked meals and tents, helping them through the initial crisis.

Muslim Hands has been providing relief in Indonesia since the Aceh Tsunami in 2004. With your support, we are rebuilding communities affected by the recent tsunamis, with initiatives such as the Community Kitchen and the Dongala School Project.



Rawalakot Housing Project

fter landslides caused by heavy rains destroyed their homes, families living in the village of Akhorban in Rawalakot, Pakistan were left with nothing. Unable to afford new homes, they were living in makeshift shelters on the side of a mountain. In 2016, Muslim Hands provided the families with emergency winter relief, but there was a great need for a long-term solution. In December 2018, we completed the building of 11 new houses (consisting of one room, one bathroom and a veranda) and the reconstruction of two existing houses. This project was funded entirely by Tyler Hoffman Solicitors, whose generous donation allowed us to provide 13 families with safe shelter, improving their living conditions and restoring their dignity. ur team is on the ground distributing urgently needed food to the families of Yemen, including essentials such as rice, kidney beans, vegetables and oil. Your donations have provided emergency food parcels to the worst-affected areas in Sana'a, Aden, Hadhramout and Ta'iz.

School Meals

10 fully-equipped health clinics will be set up in rural areas, including physicians and paramedics.

Food Parcels Each

family will receive a monthly food pack consisting of essentials such as flour, rice, kidney beans, oil, vegetables, salt and sugar.



BAKHRI'S STORY

B akhri is 18 years old, and he lived with his widowed mother, Aisha, in Ta'iz, until shelling forced them to flee their village. They walked for miles across mountains to reach safety. During their escape, a rocket landed near Bakhri, driving a piece of shrapnel into his back and paralysing him from the waist down. He will be confined to a wheelchair for the rest of his life.

As a healthy young man, Bakhri worked in the local farm to provide for his elderly mother. They had a home, an income and a community. Their lives were normal and stable. Now, Aisha and Bakhri rely on charity just to survive. When this isn't enough, they fast, praying that tomorrow will bring a meal.

This winter, your donations provided Bakhri and his mother with much-needed emergency food supplies. The food parcels you sent them contained essentials such as flour, kidney beans and vegetables, allowing them to satisfy their hunger. We pray that Allah (swt)

Empowering the Women of Niger

Your donations are empowering the women of Mali and Niger to provide for their families. From running free sewing courses to helping widows set up their own businesses, your generosity is providing women with a sustainable source of income.

At just 28 years old, Ramafou is a widow with eight children. Before Muslim Hands gave her three goats in November 2018, she had no stable source of income.

Her husband used to work as a trader and was the only breadwinner in the family. Her relatives were too poor to help her after he died, and she struggled to provide her children with even simple foodstuffs like cassava (a type of basic porridge). Ramafou's family live in a small mud-brick house, and share two beds, one of which is outside because of the lack of space. Ramafou has few possessions, the most valuable of which is a copy of the Holy Qur'an.

Ramafou's life has been completely transformed by the simple gift of three female goats. Not only can she now provide her children with nutritious milk every day, she can also sell surplus milk to buy them food and other necessities. Each goat will produce two kids per year which she can either sell or keep to produce more milk. Ramafou is full of hope for the future.





It took less than £400 to give Ramafou a sustainable source of food and income to provide for her children. She is immeasurably grateful to our donors for helping her and her children.

uslim Hands has been running the Gaza Winter Walks for 11 years now to help raise money for our various projects in Gaza. This winter, thousands of people braved the cold in nine cities across the UK, walking five miles to raise money for the Al-Nasir Pediatric Hospital.

We caught up with Asya Kidan on the day, who told us about how her school is fundraising for Gazan children.

Afifah school has been involved in the Gaza Winter Walks since 2016, and this year 69 children and adults attended the walk. They were enthusiastic about exceeding the £1000 amount the school raised last year.

The school even involved younger children who couldn't attend, organising a 1-mile sponsored walk at the school. The children learnt about the difficulties Gazan children face and how important it is to raise money for better medical equipment.

The funds raised during the walks will provide life-saving medical equipment such as incubators and ultrasound machines for newborn babies and children. The money will also be used to support our psycho-social projects in Gaza - tragically, 95% of Gazan children show deep psychological stress, and our projects aim to restore their mental health, hope and dignity.
